Use These as a Starting Point

These ranges reflect real-world project costs across the U.S. Your specific numbers will depend on your local market, the complexity of your scope, and the quality of finishes you choose.

Always build in a **10–20% contingency buffer** for unexpected conditions uncovered during construction.

Project Type	Estimated Cost
Kitchen Remodel	\$25,000 – \$100,000+
Bathroom Remodel	\$10,000 – \$50,000+
Home Addition	\$50,000 – \$200,000+

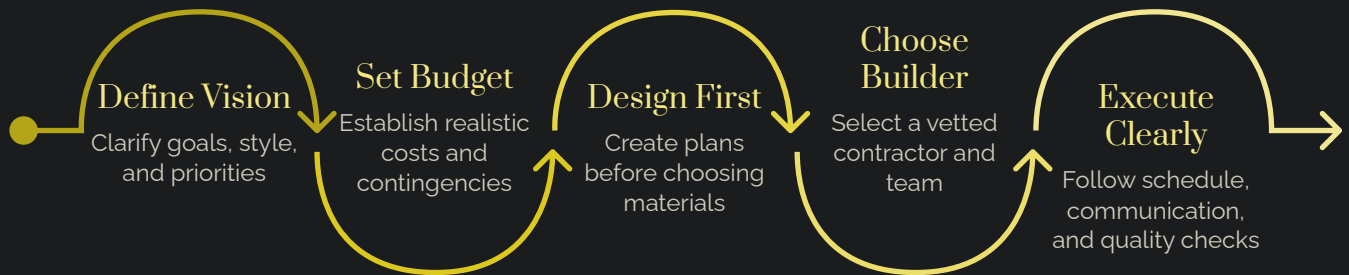
